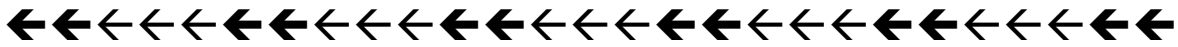

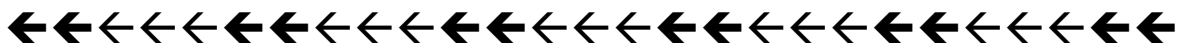

Notes:

- 1) When a peh (פ) shows at the end of a word we use a (ף) instead.
- 2) Another very short God name is yud-heh or YAH. Sometimes it is used as a suffix as in הַלְלוּיָהּ
- 3) The dageshed Tav (תּ) once had a different sound than the one without (ת). In Israeli and Sephardic pronunciations today, they are the same, in Ashkenaz(i.e. Eastern European) the Tav (תּ) was a T sound and the undageshed (ת) was an S sound. In some Christian and older Classical Reform publications you might see a transliteration of (תּ) as TH, as in all those Synagogues Named בֵּית Beit (the house of) something but pronouncing it Beth.
- 4) This psalm is actually much longer and has four verses. It was shortened here for practice of the pei sofit.
